Enrique Dussel's writings span the theology of liberation; critiques of discourse ethics; evaluations of Marx, Levinas, Habermas, and others; but most importantly, the development of a philosophy written from the underside of Eurocentric modernist teleologies, an ethics of the impoverished, and the articulation of a unique Latin American theoretical perspective. This anthology of original articles by U.S. philosophers elucidating Dussel's thought offers critical analyses from a variety of perspectives, including feminist ones. A final chapter by Dussel responds to these philosophers.
